



PACIFIC OCEAN

PLACES

Santiago is the capital and largest city of Chile as well as one of the largest cities in the Americas. It is the center of Chile's largest and the most densely populated conurbation, the Santiago Metropolitan Region, whose total population is 7 million. The city is entirely located in the country's central valley. The forecast between June to August is cool and humid, with cool to cold mornings; typical daily maximum temperatures of 14°C, and low temperatures near 0°C.

Valparaíso is a major city, seaport, and educational center. "Greater Valparaíso" is the second largest metropolitan area in the country. Valparaíso is located about 120 km northwest of Santiago by road (1 hour 10 minutes) and is one of the South Pacific's most important seaports. Valparaíso is the capital of Chile's third most populated administrative region and has been the head-quarters for the Chilean National Congress since 1990. Valparaíso has a very mild Mediterranean climate. In the winter, rainfall can occasionally be extremely heavy, but frequency of such rains varies greatly from year to year. Typical daily maximum temperatures of 10°C, and low temperatures near 5°C

- Iquique is a port city in northern Chile. It lies on the Pacific coast, west of the Pampa del Tamarugal which is part of Atacama Desert. It had a population of 180,601. The city developed during the heyday of the nitrate mining in Atacama Desert in the 19th century. Originally a Peruvian city with a large Chilean population, it was ceded to Chile as result of War of the Pacific (1879–1883). Today it is one of only two free ports of Chile and one of the largest duty-free commercial port centers of South America, the Zona Franca of Iquique which has been traditionally called Zofri. There are around 2.4 square kilometres of warehouses, banking branches, and restaurants. Iquique has a rare mild desert climate with low extremes of temperatures all year round and almost no rainfall. Typical daily maximum temperatures of 16°C, and low temperatures near 12°C.
- Pisagua became an important port of the South Pacific during the nitrate boom of the 1870s. During the first years of the 20th century, this port had become one of the most important ports of the whole country (after Valparaíso and Iquique), with offices from major banks, and one of the most beautiful cities on the Southern Pacific coast. Unfortunately now is an small cove and most of its arquitecture heritage is abandoned. In the first years of the XX Century, Pisagua has often been used as a concentration camp for political prisoners, male homosexuals, anarchists and leftwing militants. This happened during the rule of the presidents Carlos Ibáñez del Campo (1927-1931), as well as of Gabriel González Videla (1946-1952) and more recently, during Augusto Pinochet's dictatorship (1973-1990). Many bodies have been found in the ocean and several graves have been discovered in Pisagua since the end of Pinochet's military regime. Pisagua is geographically isolated, with the ocean on one side and a big desert on the other. Typical daily maximum temperatures of 20°C, and low temperatures near 12°C.

- Pica is a town situated in the inland of the Atacama Desert on an oasis. This place is well known worldwide due to its very small lemons. These products extracted from agriculture represent a major source of income for this region, because they are sold all over Chile. This little oasis has 6,178 inhabitants. Typical daily maximum temperatures of 28°C, and low temperatures near 5°C.
- Quisma Valley is located 10 km from Pica and its environment is characterized by being a narrow valley surrounded by dunes that contain water reserves. This situation has allowed to maintain an agriculture system since ancient times. Currently this agriculture has meant the production of tropical fruits such as mangoes, guavas and grapefruits.
- La Tirana is located some 72 km from Iquique, every year the Festival of the Virgin of La Tirana takes place. More than 350,000 people come to the town to be part of this celebration, which lasts a little over a week. Its important date is 16 of July. But La Tirana is much more than just a religious celebration, it is a cultural exchange with Andean roots. Every year you can see the outfits that the troupes wear, you can listen to the music that floats into the air from the instruments and watch the dances they perform in its little streets. It is a tradition that is part-indigenous, part-mestizo and part Afro-Andean, mixing all these peoples that inhabited these areas in days gone by. Typical daily maximum temperatures of 30°C, and low temperatures near 0°C.
- The Atacama Giant is a large anthropomorphic geoglyph in the región de Tarapacá (Atacama Desert) and is located on "Cerro Unitas". This is the largest prehistoric anthropomorphic figure in the world with a length of 119 metres. Some researchers have assured that this image belongs to a deity that represented to the local inhabitants from AD 1000 to 1400.
- Pabellón de Pica and Chanavaya are located 75 km. on the coastline to the south of Iquique. The sector is surrounded by impressive cliffs, being in the past habitat of seabirds that left dense deposits of red guano, estimating fossil reserves of this material in five million tons. The abandoned guano mining operations of could be visited, existing a monolith reminder in recognition to the Chinese slaves used in the guano extraction tasks, which says in its text: "In memory of our compatriots who arrived to these lands giving their work and their lives in the silence of anonymity. The Chinese Colony of Iquique more than 100 years of its history, gives a fair homage and giving Christian burial. Signed Chinese Colony of Iquique, June 1979 ". Typical daily maximum temperatures of 16°C, and low temperatures near 12°C.



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
